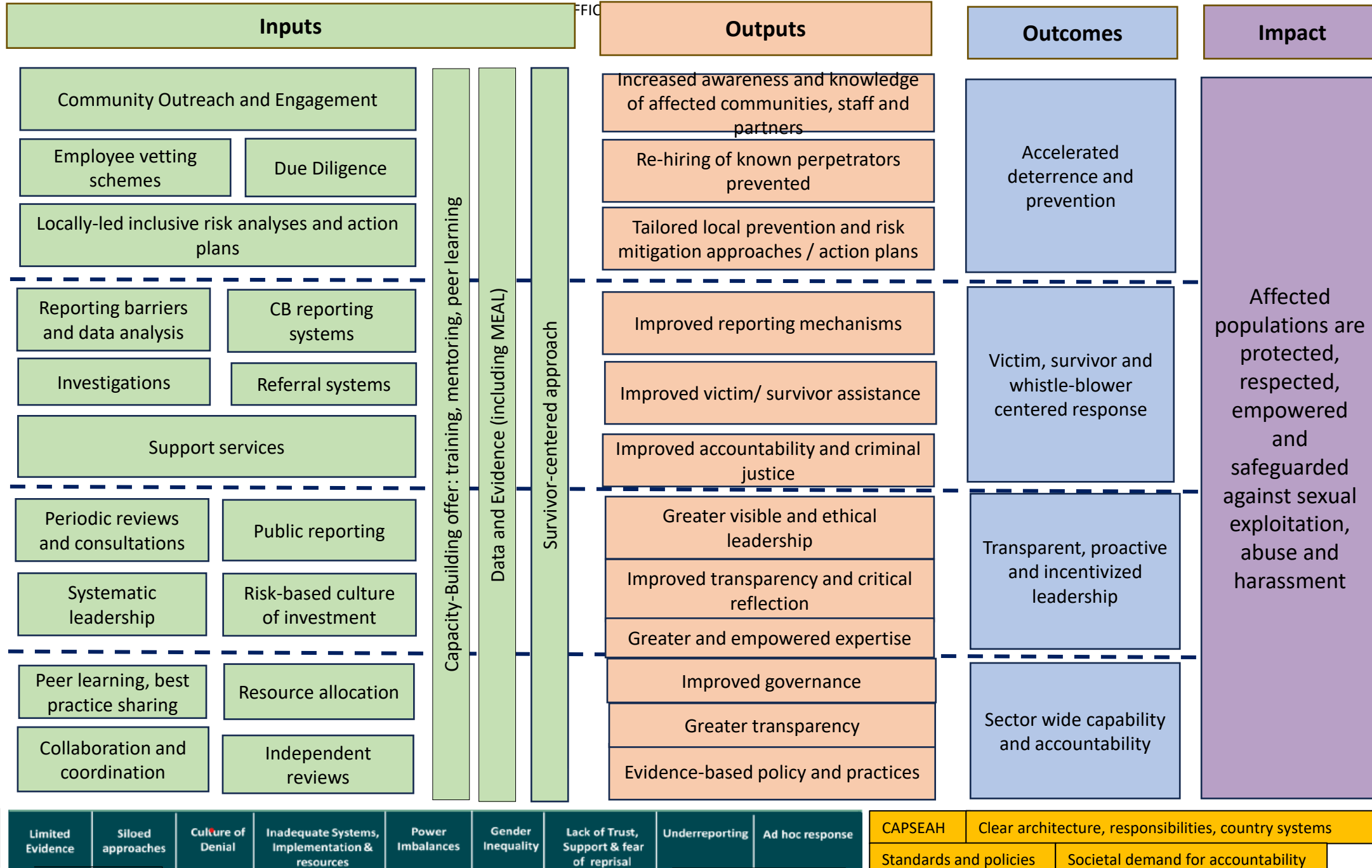


Global Public Goods

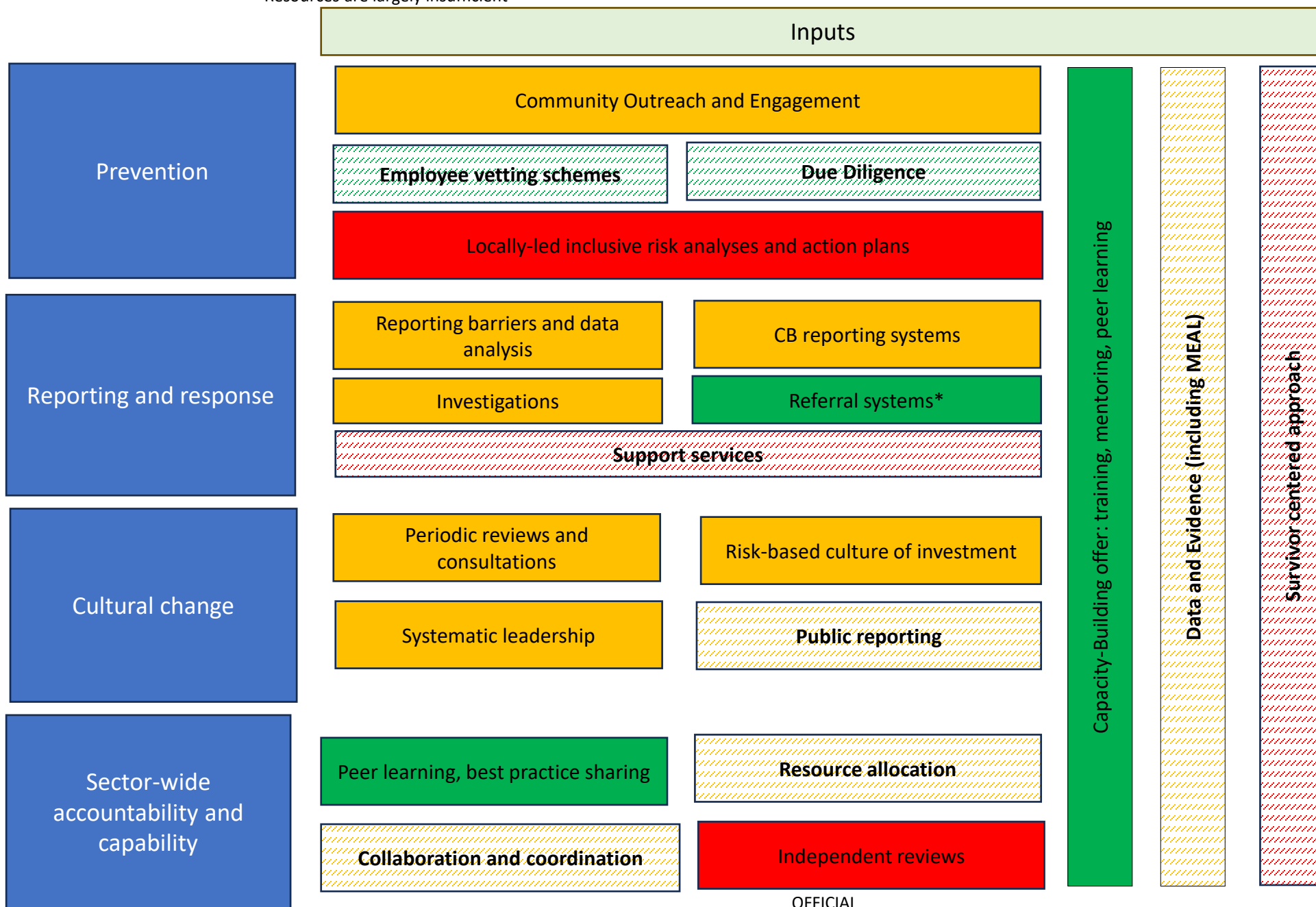
Weaknesses and threats

RAG rating

- Resources available – should be maintained; efficiencies are possible
- Resources are insufficient and/or efficiencies are necessary
- Resources are largely insufficient

- OFFICIAL Best resourced at local and national level
- Best resourced at global level



Indicative criteria to invest at global or countrylevel:

- Global: widespread demand, potential or realized economies of scale, best managed at HQ level.
- Country: needs tailoring to be most effective, might only be needed in some contexts, best managed at country level.
